

The wonders of Reykjanes with a visit to the Blue Lagoon

Description



The Reykjanes peninsula is located on a drift zone, between two continents, the North American plate and the Eurasian plate. It is a unique site where you can find different elements that exist because of the drift zone; geothermal energy, lava fields and other natural phenomenon. During this tour we will stop at Krýsuvík geothermal area which is situated south of Reykjanes in the middle of the fissure zone on the Mid-Atlantic Ridge which traverses Iceland. Krýsuvík consists of several geothermal fields, such as Seltún. We continue to Kleifarvatn lake which is the largest lake on the Reykjanes Peninsula. The lake has no visible water coming in or going out as most of its water comes and leaves underground. Its beautiful black sand beaches are a great photo stop. As we drive though the lava fields we arrive at the Blue Lagoon. The Lagoon is a unique wonder of nature; a lake with pleasantly warm **mineral-rich geothermal water** in the middle of a **black lava field**. The high natural levels of **silica and minerals** give the Lagoon its rich blue colour. A visit to the **Blue Lagoon** is both invigorating and exiting, whether one bathes there surrounded by snow in the middle of the winter or in the long summer daylight. You will relax there for approximately one and a half hours.



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
